Law matters

→ Directive 2006/123/EC on services

**Directive 2005/36/EC on
professional qualifications**

temporary mobility –allows work in another EU country on basis of a declaration made in advance

establishment in another EU country – to permanently work in country where they didn't obtain their professional qualification

systems of recognition of qualifications –

automatic recognition –harmonised minimum training conditions (i.e. nurses, midwives, doctors, dental practitioners, pharmacists, architects and veterinary surgeons)

general system –other regulated professions (e.g. teachers, translators, real estate agents)

automatic recognition on the basis of professional experience – (e.g. carpenters, upholsterers, beauticians)

knowledge of languages and professional academic titles

What is a *regulated* profession?

→ you have to hold a specific degree to access the profession, sit special exams such as state exams and/or register with a professional body before you can practise it.

If your profession is regulated in the EU country where you want to practise, you may need to apply to get your professional qualification recognised there.

the regulated professions database

Generic name of professions in this database

The generic names of professions are headings under which the regulated professions in the respective countries are grouped together.

For example: The following regulated professions are grouped together under the generic name of "Tourist Guide":

- "Guide touristique" in France
- "Guide interprète régional", also in France
- "Guida turistica" in Italy

Please note

The only authentic name of a regulated profession is that of the language of the country in which the profession is regulated. Any translation of this title on this website is purely indicative.

The generic professions aim to give an indication about the general scope of activities of the regulated professions and to help find regulated professions which are listed in the language of the country in which they are regulated. However, Member States are free to choose under which generic heading they insert their regulated professions and no assessment has been made of the areas of activity covered by each generic profession, therefore:

- Two regulated professions grouped under the same generic heading could cover different activities.
- At the same time, two regulated professions falling under separate generic headings could cover similar activities.


